Visitors park their RV's in the 14 RV parks in and around the town or use BLM camping nearby. Visitors are treated to small world of local business, all types of seasonal vendors, shows, and special events. The Pacific Cruiser Rally was held at Rice Ranch South complete with full hookups (very rare for Quartzside).
