SPRINGTIME IN COARSEGOLD

MAY 30, 31 AND JUNE 1

Co-hosted by Lillian and Marc Trubert and Donna and Dave de Graffenreid

This rally will be a two club rally as both the "GMC Pacific Cruisers" from Southern California and the "GMC 49ers" from Northern California will band together for good times near Yosemite National Park in the beautiful foothills on the road to Yosemite. However you choose to come, Highway 41 off the 99 Hwy towards the mountains is the route.

Destination is the Yosemite South KOA near the Chuckchansi Resort and Casino with side trips of your choice to the Sugar Pine Railroad including a barbeque, train ride into the forest at night and a campfire with entertainment (@ \$55 per person), Private Bass Lake consisting of a scenic boat ride about 1 ½ hours (@ \$10 - \$15 person) and the 1 and ½ hour Tram Tour of the Big Trees at the Mariposa Grove just inside the gate to Yosemite on a first come, first served basis (@ \$25 per person). An all day long tour of Yosemite by the local tour company Mountain Shuttle using a Suburban with picks ups and return to the KOA (@ \$135). Plenty of restaurants, antiqueing and junktiqueing, museums, wine tasting and scenic routes are easily accessible. While Coarsegold is small and boasts a Karaoke Bar, weird shopping and teepee, Oakhurst is 6 miles away and has everything including a Kaiser medical office.

The extra side trips are not included in the rally fee so each person can choose what interests him or her. If you include those fees then reservations will be made for you, but if you don't, you can make your own reservations. We do not think that will be a problem. DIRECTIONS: From the south go on CA-99 N past the Grapevine, follow CA-99 N to Yosemite EXIT 131 in Fresno, merge onto CA-41 N, follow the road (freeway) through Fresno, then a two-way road to the KOA on your left (38.4 miles from CA-99).

From the North go on CA-99 S to EXIT 155 (Madera), turn left on W Cleveland Ave, go over the freeway, then still on W Cleveland, cross the railroad and immediately turn right then slightly left toward the mountains, drive 1.9 miles following W Cleveland Ave to CA-145 in Madera, and turn left and follow CA-145 for 14.4 miles to reach CA-41. Turn left on CA-41, and drive north 17.6 miles to the KOA on your left.

This is a rally for all of us who live in and enjoy our California life style while in the foothills of Yosemite Valley. We will “knock the socks off” of the locals as we come parading through the small village of Coarsegold (up the road a piece) – a watering station on the southern end for intrepid travelers of the Gold Rush era. The cost is based on essentials needs, and you will choose the activities that interested you and pay for them a la carte. We can make reservations for you if you want, but we have to have the money up front. It is also possible to decide after you arrive as space may still be available. We will help you get where you want to go, but a tow car would be a good idea if possible.

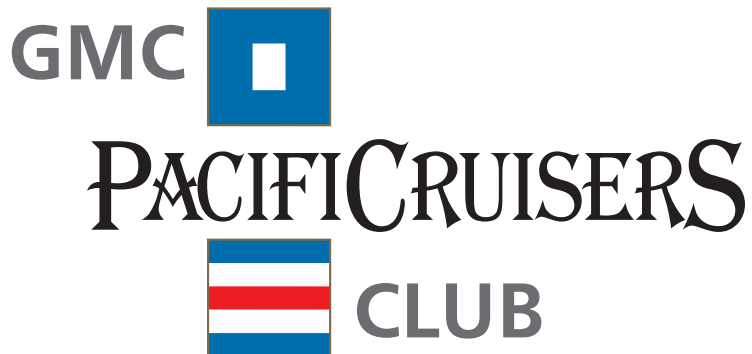
