NOTES FROM YOUR CLUB TREASURER CHANGE TO GMC PACIFIC CRUISERS BY-LAWS

At a Membership Meeting during a past rally, members voted to change the By-laws with reference to annual dues and charges for receiving printed copies of the club newsletter.

The changes are as follows.

1. Annual membership dues will change from \$15 to \$25 a year.

2. Annual charge for receiving a printed copy of the club newsletter via U.S. Mail will change from \$5.00 to \$10.00 a year.

All GMCPC members will continue to receive the club newsletter via e-Mail at no charge.

JUST A REMINDER

In addition and just a reminder, the GMCPC fiscal year runs from October 1st to September 30th of each year. If you have not done so, please renew your membership so your name will be listed in the new GMCPC Roster. (All club members must also have paid up membership in FMCA, Family Motor Coaching Association.)

PROPOSED GMCWS BY-LAW CHANGES

At the Business Meeting in Paso Robles, a proposal for a major change to the By-laws was made. GMCWS members were recently mailed a letter detailing the changes and asking that comments be sent to GMCWS. Later members will be mailed a ballot to vote on the proposed change. Below is a synopsis of what those changes would be.

The change being proposed is to allow former GMCWS members who no longer own a GMC and now own an SOB (some other brand) to become full members of GMCWS. To be an Associate Member, the member must be a former GMC owner & GMCWS member who no longer owns any coach. An Associate member would not be able to hold office or vote.

For the proponents of this change, the rationale is that since membership is falling in all the clubs, this change will keep the member numbers up, allow former members that now own an SOB to hold office & vote as a member, and allow former members to remain socially active with the club. Opponents want to maintain a GMC only club and believe these changes will be a first step towards losing the GMC community that exists today.

Pacific Cruisers will be discussing the pro's & cons of this proposal at the Nov 16-19 Fountain of Youth Rally. If you won't be at the Rally and have comments you would like to make, call or email Bobbie Schultz or Audree Rowe. Your views will be brought up at the Rally.

TUCALOTA TWO

In September the Pacific Cruisers went back to one of our favorite RV parks, Tocalota Springs, just outside Hemet. We had been there several times before and had always just kicked back and enjoyed the ambiance. This rally was different. A challenge was issued to the attendees to participate in a weekend of competition of all kinds. As the activity schedule said, "you will participate in games of brain, brawn, skill and chance". And participate they did.

The goody bag we always get upon arrival contained one red and one blue bandana with instructions for each attendee to choose a bandana and wear it to happy hour and at all other times during the rally. Also included was a full sheet of illustrations on cool and creative ways for "stylin" the bandana.

At happy hour, attendees found out that the color of the bandana designated which team they would be on. The competition would be Reds against Blues. We were pleased to welcome some new GMC owners and first timers, the Ciccarelli family, Tom and Patrice and their two sons, Jeff and Jeremy. Our catered dinner chosen to meet "training table" requirements consisted of a traditional roast turkey dinner, complete with all the sides, and apple AND pumpkin pies for dessert. After dinner the games began with LRC (Left, Right, & Center). Each player received 4 quarters and played for the jackpot. Afterward, the night was still young and we gathered our chairs around a campfire (thanks Hoss) to enjoy looking at the stars and making and eating our deluxe S'Mores. Cinnamon-sugar graham crackers instead of regular ones makes all the difference.

Next morning, after breakfast on your own, the teams gathered outside on the playing field. The first game was The Big Sweeper. Teams lined up and one at a time each player took hold of a household broom and got four tries to sweep a tennis ball into a target with cut out openings worth different amounts of points. With their

teammates calling out encouragement, players were very creative with the broom. Who would have thought of lying on the ground and using it like a pool cue? Rallymasters refereed and kept careful tally of each team's total score.

Then on to game two, Ping Pong. In this competition, each player got a pod of 6 ping pong balls and had to throw them at a standing target studded with plastic glasses marked with different point values. How far can one throw a ping pong ball? What happens to your aim when the breeze kicks up? All this and more was revealed. Again the referees kept track of team score.

For game three, each team lined up along the sides of a picnic table and got a box with a jigsaw puzzle in it. The puzzles were identical and the competition was to see which team could complete their puzzle first. Try this and you'll see it requires good communication and teamwork. Again the referees recorded the win.

Game four was the Memory Game. Under a cover on a table were 63 items that might commonly be found in a GMC motorhome like a set of GMC keys, a box of fuses, a roll of duct tape, a comb, a flashlight, a bar of soap—you get the idea. The items were uncovered and teams were given five minutes to study the objects and try to memorize what was laid out there. After five minutes the items were covered and each team was allowed 15 minutes to huddle and list as many of the items as they could remember.

All that competing worked up an appetite for the catered picnic lunch that was set up in the shade of the beautiful old oak trees. What did we have to eat? We had assorted sandwiches, several kinds of salads including one of cut up fresh fruits, individual bags of chips, cold cans of soda and for dessert, homemade cookies.

After lunch, there was time to explore the park amenities, use the pool, take a nap, or just kick back and enjoy the company of friends. We were

joined by some visitors. Dave and Leone Woods, who were looking for a coach after theirs burned, drove up for a visit. Barbara McCurter and two of her daughters also visited and Barbara, never one to come empty handed, served up a delicious chocolate cake. Dorthy Hooton, who is a quilter, asked the ladies if they would help with some quilt work that needed doing. She brought out a stack of colorful patchwork lap quilts that were put together by her quilting guild but needed hand tying. Willing hands got to work and helped her complete 13 lap quilts that will be given to men and women at Camp Pendleton as part of the Wounded Warrior program.

Saturday night's catered dinner was lasagna, with salad, garlic bread, and for dessert, cream filled eclairs. Pacific Cruisers do know how to eat, don't they? We want to renew your membership for 2018 if you haven't done it all ready, See Joe or Judy.

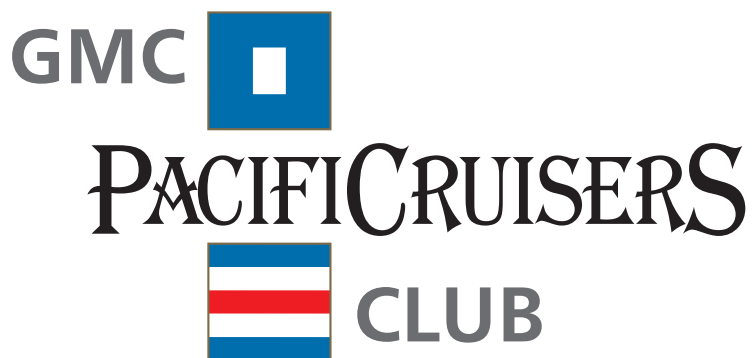
