The yearly Balloon Festival is held right near the London Bridge at Lake Havasu with plenty of dry camping. We were at the Lake Havasu State Park with lots of other motorhomes. There were wristbands for easy access to the Festival grounds for all 3 days and the free shuttle ran back & forth.

There wasn't a lot of "balloon launching" this year because there was a lot of wind. They sent up trial balloons Friday, Saturday and Sunday but the upper atmosphere would have given them a wild ride right across the lake. There were several tethered balloons and some big character balloons inflated.

Our dozen or so GMC group was dry camped all together right on the side of Lake Havasu. We had quite a few visitors, from the other motorhomes parked around us, come by to check us out. We were treated to several incredible on-the-spot meals. Continental breakfasts were set out each morning and then Bob Lamey decided to add his campstove cooked eggs & bacon. Wednesday we planned a potluck dinner but Lynda Harris fixed us hot dogs, sloppy joes, beans & salad. Thursday we enjoyed Scotty's Broasted Chicken along with homemade salads & cookies. Friday & Saturday, Bob & Karen Lamey treated us to meals from their huge cast iron pots - Chili & Cornbread one night, Beef Stew & a Cobbler dessert another. Of course there was a "Hoss" bonfire each evening, plenty of adult beverages and many discussions about what everyone had already done to their rig and what they planned to do next. There were several thrift shops very close by & some of us got to compare purchases on Saturday night.

During the day, the Festival also had a huge Flea Market with very unique items for sale. There was a lot of hand-made items that are only sold locally in Arizona, metal cut outs, jewelry, wind chimes, clothing and food! We ate everything, just like we were at a County Fair. We had strawberry funnel cakes, Indian flatbread tacos, huge made on the spot corn dogs, giant turkey legs, bar-b-q from 3 different vendors. This was a real easy and very social rally. With access to the Balloon Festival by shuttle, day & night, you could come and go when you wanted. Saturday morning was time for the Johnson's famous "Omelet in a Bag". They have preserved his 35 room, 5000sf pueblo that is built entirely of found and repurposed materials. it is on the National Register of Historic Places and you can check it out at www.cabotsmuseum.org We had a group tour and were all amazed by what he had built. Thanks to Jacqui, Art and Bobbie Schultz for this outing. We never would have even heard of it without your arranging the tour.

Saturday afternoon back at the barn was libations, chips and dips, that darn Elvis puzzle and on our own for naps, reading, much talking and exploring the neighborhood. We did see a couple of local GMC's in yards in various states of disrepair, just sitting out in the sun. Several of our members said they would try again to catch the owners at home and invite them to join the group. To me, none of them looked like they had moved in a long time.

Saturday night Jacqui whipped up a meal of roast chicken and vegetables for everyone. She acted like cooking full meals, 2 kinds of chicken, for almost 20 people was a daily occurrence!
